In the frame of CircusDanceFestival in cooperation with Deutsches Tanzarchiv Köln
A project led by Dr. Mirjam Hildbrand, Dr. des. Johanna Hilari

The Archive Lab is an artistic-reflexive research laboratory for dance and circus students and/or practitioners, especially Master's students. The laboratory will take place between May 13th (evening) and 18th 2024, in Cologne, in the frame of CircusDanceFestival, in collaboration with Deutsches Tanzarchiv Köln. The term "archive" is understood as collection of different materials from the past and present (such as physical practices, theoretical texts, visual documents and also objects), which relate to the field of performing arts.

During the laboratory you will have time and space to engage with, reflect on and react to the corpus of material. By participating you will develop your own artistic and/or reflective approach and make it productive for your future practice, furthermore you will expand your physical and discursive knowledge. The laboratory closes with a presentation of the individual research results.

The Archive Lab is led by Dr. Mirjam Hildbrand and Dr. des. Johanna Hilari, both Dramaturges and Dance/Theatre Researchers from Switzerland. They bring vast experience in interweaving methods and methodologies of critical theory with artistic practices and processes. The format of the laboratory is process-oriented and co-depends on the interests and experience of the invited participants. The working language is English. The group will consist of maximum 15 international students, artists, practitioners or researchers from different European cities. The working spaces will be at Deutsches Tanzarchiv Köln and the site of CircusDanceFestival.

Context of the Archive Lab within CircusDanceFestival:

On the occasion of the admission of Circus in Germany's intangible cultural heritage list in 2023 and its recognition as an independent form within the performing arts, the upcoming festival edition in 2024 initiates various formats that deal with questions of heritage, innovation and renewal. The VOICES magazine will discuss the contemporary re-location of the figure of the clown.
